TENNESSEE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE DIVISION OF ANIMAL HEALTH

SUMMARY: LIVESTOCK HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR FAIRS AND EXHIBITIONS I GENERAL:

A. All stalls, pens, chutes, etc. located on the grounds of fairs and exhibitions shall be thoroughly cleaned and disinfected with a disinfectant approved by USDA, APHIS between each scheduled fair or exhibition.

C. All livestock (except poultry and equine) that enter fairs and exhibitions shall be accompanied by an official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection with individual permanent identification. Certificates for this purpose shall be valid for ninety (90) days from date of issue. (Tennessee livestock only – out-of-state certificates are valid for thirty (30) days from the date of issue)

D. No animal showing clinical signs of infectious or communicable disease shall be allowed to enter or remain on premises of fairs or exhibitions. It shall be the responsibility of the manager of each event to assure prompt removal of such animals.

II LIVESTOCK AND POULTRY ORIGINATING WITHIN THE STATE OF TENNESSEE

[Certificates of Veterinary Inspection Valid for a Period of Ninety (90) Days]

A. SWINE: All swine which enter fairs and exhibitions shall be accompanied by an official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection with individual permanent identification or sufficient description to identify each animal.

B. CATTLE: All cattle which enter fairs and exhibitions shall be accompanied by an official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection with individual permanent, official identification.

C. POULTRY: (1) Sponsors of poultry shows or exhibitions shall notify the Tennessee Department of Agriculture at least thirty (30) days prior to show or exhibition.

(2) Poultry found not to be in apparent good health shall be removed immediately from any show or exhibition.

D. HORSES & OTHER EQUIDAE: Horses and other Equidae six (6) months of age and older must have a negative Equine Infectious Anemia test within the preceding twelve (12) months.

E. SHEEP: (1) All sheep imported into or through Tennessee shall be accompanied by an official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection and be in compliance with 0080-2-1-.02, and Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4. (2) All sheep that move within the state, with the exception of wethers under the age of 18 months that are produced for slaughter only, including for change of ownership, shows, fairs, expositions or slaughter shall be permanently, individually identified by a method approved in Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.

F. GOATS: (1) Goats imported into or through Tennessee shall be accompanied by an official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection and be in compliance with 0080-2-1-.02, and Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4. (2) Goats imported into Tennessee for immediate slaughter to an approved slaughter establishment or to an approved livestock market for sale to a slaughter establishment shall only be required to have a transportation document and be in compliance with Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4. (3) All registered breeding goats, goats that have been commingled with sheep, goats for exhibition and dairy goats that move within the state, including for change of ownership, shows, fairs, expositions or slaughter shall be permanently, individually identified by a method approved in Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4. (3) through 79.4.

G. CAMELIDS: Camelids must have an official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection as provided in Rule 0080-2-3-.01 (1).

H. CAPTIVE CERVIDAE: Captive Cervidae must have an official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection as provided in Rule 0080-2-3-.01 (1).

III LIVESTOCK AND POULTRY ORIGINATING OUTSIDE THE STATE OF TENNESSEE

Livestock and Poultry entering fairs and exhibitions from areas outside the State of Tennessee shall be subject to current Tennessee import requirements. Please contact the state veterinarian's office regarding questions or recent changes to these rules. These interstate requirements are summarized as follows: A. ALL SPECIES (except poultry): Official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection valid for thirty (30) days and individual permanent official identification, except for equine. Equine must have sufficient description to identify the animal.

B. CATTLE: Certificate of Veterinary Inspection and additional requirements as follows: (1) Tuberculosis: No requirements except for cattle originating from regions not considered free of tuberculosis. (2) Brucellosis: No requirements except for cattle originating from regions not considered free of brucellosis. Test eligible cattle – Intact male or female cattle eighteen (18) months or older. (Vaccinates and non-vaccinates)

C. SWINE: No testing requirements for swine unless originating from a region not considered free of Brucellosis and Pseudorabies.

D. HORSES AND OTHER EQUINES: Animals six (6) months of age or older - negative equine infectious anemia (Swamp Fever) test within twelve (12) months. E. POULTRY: Originate directly from a Pullorum-Typhoid Clean Flock and an H5/H7 Avian Influenza Clean Flock or be accompanied by evidence of a negative Pullorum-Typhoid test within ninety (90) days and a negative Avian Influenza test within twenty-one (21) days.

F. SHEEP: (1) All sheep imported into or through Tennessee shall be accompanied by an official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection and be in compliance with 0080-2-1-.02, and Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4. (2) All sheep that move within the state, including for change of ownership, shows, fairs, expositions or slaughter shall be permanently, individually identified by a method approved in Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.

G. GOATS: (1) Goats imported into or through Tennessee shall be accompanied by an official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection and be in compliance with 0080-2-1-.02, and Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4. (2) Goats imported into Tennessee for immediate slaughter to an approved slaughter establishment or to an approved livestock market for sale to a slaughter establishment shall only be required to have a transportation document and be in compliance with Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4. (3) All registered breeding goats, goats that have been commingled with sheep, goats for exhibition and dairy goats that move within the state, including for change of ownership, shows, fairs, expositions or slaughter shall be permanently, individually identified by a method approved in Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4. H. CAMELIDAE: Same requirements as for cattle.

I. CERVIDAE: Certificate of Veterinary Inspection and additional requirements as follows: (1) Brucellosis: Same requirements as for cattle. (2) Tuberculosis: (a) All cervidae shall originate in herds which have had a negative herd test for tuberculosis within twelve (12) months with a USDA approved single cervical test and individual imported animals shall be negative to the single cervical test within thirty (30) days of entry; or (b) Animals not originating in tested herds as described above must test negative to two (2) single cervical tests at least ninety (90) days apart, the second test conducted not more than thirty (30) days prior to entry. NOTE: (Contact an accredited veterinarian for further details of import rules).

IV Fair association or exhibition or management shall inform exhibitors of the rules of this chapter and shall notify the State Veterinarian or her agent of any violations. Exhibitors shall present evidence of compliance with this chapter to the State Veterinarian or his agent upon request. These rules constitute a minimum legal standard and in no way restrict the right of fair and exhibition managers to establish additional or more stringent requirements.

1. Only present-year products owned and grown by Exhibitors may compete for prizes. Except for livestock, all entries must be new work, which has not been shown in a previous Middle Tennessee District Fair.

2. There will be no charge for credible exhibits. The Management reserves the right to decide whether or not exhibits shall be classed as credible. MTDF is a family-oriented event. Entries that contain language, images, or other content deemed by management to be inappropriate for showing at the fair will not be accepted.

3. Entries must comply with the quality noted in the catalog.

4. All exhibits must be delivered to the superintendent in charge of the department on the fairground, and no exhibit will be received by mail, express, or freight.

5. Only one entry per person will be accepted in any one lot except where so stated under the department head.

6. All departments are open to any person in the Tennessee Valley area unless notice is made under the head of the class in the catalog.

7. Premiums will be paid by check at a designated area beginning no later than Thursday, except livestock, and these will be paid as soon as the winners' list is completed, turned into the office, and processed. Management reserves the right to refuse payment of premiums in case of disasters such as fire, windstorm, flood, and any others beyond their control.

8. Please promptly cash the premium checks, as they will not be valid after sixty days.

EXHIBITORS RISK

The Lawrenceburg Rotary Club will use ordinary care to protect the properties of exhibitors at the fair and assumes no responsibility beyond ordinary care. The Exhibitor agrees that the Lawrenceburg Rotary Club will not be responsible for an exhibit when the Lawrenceburg Rotary Club exercises ordinary care.

REMOVAL OF EXHIBITS

EXHIBITS MAY ONLY BE REMOVED FROM THE FAIR AS FOLLOWS: Sunday, September 29th from 2:00PM until 6:00PM

Since it is necessary for the buildings to be empty by Tuesday morning following the fair, management requests that all exhibits be removed on Sunday, September 29th. In order to remove your exhibits, you must produce the "ENTRY TAGS." No superintendent has the authority to release any exhibits without the "ENTRY TAGS." Please do not request them to do so. If you expect to get exhibits for someone else, please get their tags.

Rules and Regulations:

- 1. All livestock classes are open to the world unless stated in notes dealing with that class of livestock.
- 2. All exhibitors of livestock, whether dairy cattle, beef cattle, goats, or sheep must make an application for their entries in order to be assured of pens or stalls. Said applications should be made to the Livestock Superintendent or Show Superintendent. Entries will be accepted on a first-come, first-served basis as long as space is available.
- 3. All livestock shall be exhibited at the owner's risk. The Rotary Club, sponsor of The Middle Tennessee District Fair, will not be responsible for any loss or damage to any animals or equipment, but every reasonable precaution will be taken to prevent any such loss or damage.
- 4. Any exhibitor may enter as many animals as he/she desires, but not more than two prizes will be paid in any one lot to one exhibitor. Where there is only one entry in any livestock lot, the judge will have the option of awarding a first or second premium.
- 5. All animals must be entered in the owner's name and NO ANIMALS WILL BE ACCEPTED FOR ENTRY UNTIL REGISTRATION CERTIFICATE HAS BEEN PRESENTED. An exception will be made for Commercial heifers in Junior Shows. All animals can be checked for corresponding tattoo numbers and certificates if the superintendent desires. Health papers may be crosschecked against registration papers.
- 6. In the "Other Breeds" classes, animals to be shown must be Purebred and registered in their National Association.
- 7. Exhibitors must furnish their own feed and equipment. <u>All animals must be kept in places assigned to them</u>. Tieout time will be 9:00 PM each night for beef cattle. All beef cattle should be in the barn, in the wash rack area, or in the process of returning to the barns by 9:00 AM each morning. No straw will be allowed in the barn.
- 8. ANY EXHIBITOR OR THEIR REPRESENTATIVE WHO FAILS TO FOLLOW LIVESTOCK RULES OR WHO SHOWS DISRESPECT TO SHOW OR FAIR OFFICIALS CAN HAVE THEIR EXHIBITS REMOVED FROM THE SHOW RING, FORFEIT ANY AND ALL PREMIUMS REWARDED AND CAN LOSE THEIR PRIVILEGE OF EXHIBITING AT FUTURE MIDDLE TENNESSEE DISTRICT FAIRS.
- 9. ALL LIVESTOCK EXHIBITED AT THE MIDDLE TENNESSEE DISTRICT FAIR MUST HAVE VALID HEALTH PAPERS. HEALTH PAPERS WILL BE VERIFIED BY THE SUPERINDENT PRIOR TO UNLOADING OF AN ANIMAL.
- 10. NO LATE ADMITTANCE IS ACCEPTED WITHOUT WRITTEN PERMISSION FROM LIVESTOCK SUPERINTENDENT.
- 11. ANY EXHIBITOR LEAVING BEFORE DESIGNATED RELEASE TIME WITHOUT WRITTEN PERMISSION FROM LIVESTOCK SUPERINTENDENT WILL FORFEIT ALL PREMIUM MONEY EARNED.
- 12. ALL ENTRY FEES ARE TO BE PAID WHEN LIVESTOCK IS ENTERED INTO THE SHOW.
- 13. BEEF CLASSES ARE TO BE DETERMINED AFTER REGISTRATION. NATIONAL REGISTRY AND RULES APPLY TO ALL CATTLE.
- 14. Grade Level for ALL JUNIOR SHOWMANSHIP eligibility is grade level on January 1 of the current year.



 - B. The importance of honeybees to agriculture or mankind.
 - C. Stages of a honeybees life.
 - D. Must be 14" x 22" in size.

7. Candles may be single or in a pair and must weigh between one-half and one pound. Wax cake entries must weigh one pound each.

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

Flower Show Rules:

1. ALL ENTRIES MUST BE NAMED TO BE ELIGIBLE FOR A BLUE RIBBON. Make an effort to include the variety and the <u>botanic</u> name of your entry. At some point in the future, the Botanic name will be required to receive the Best of Show in a Class. Plant material does not have to be named in the design class.

2. Judging is based on "Handbook for Flower Shows" which can be read at the Lawrence County Public Library in the reference section. One ribbon grouping, consisting of Blue 1st, Red 2nd, and White 3rd may be awarded to each lot, with a Best of Show in each class chosen from its 1st place winners.

3. All pots must be clean and not more than ten inches in diameter with the exception of hanging plants which are not to be more than twelve inches in diameter. Hanging plants may be on a stand which the exhibitor must provide. Plants must be free from insects, disease, insecticide residue, and dead plant material.

4. Bring a transparent, unlabeled glass bottle for each cut specimen. The stem should be visible. Be sure the bottle is heavy enough to support the weight of the specimen.

5. It is desirable that the specimen be firmly held upright in the bottle. Wedge the specimen in the bottle with crumpled plastic wrap.

6. An exhibitor may enter more than one specimen per lot if the specimens are of different varieties.

For example, in Lot 12 of Roses, an exhibitor could enter 2 exhibits if they are different varieties: such as Abraham Lincoln, or Black Beauty.

7. All horticulture specimens, cut or potted, must have been grown by the exhibitor, and in his possession for at least 3 months. Containers with multiple plantings need to have been in the exhibitor's possession for a minimum of six weeks.

8. The design class' fresh plant material may not be treated (outside substance applied or ingested. (See page 154 of the HANDBOOK. Dry material may be embellished. Plant material may be homegrown or purchased.

9. The use of any plant or part of a plant on the State Conservation List is strictly prohibited.






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
